Entry Process:	<p>There are two methods of entry for this year's event. The original paper entry process and the online entry system.</p> <p>Entry via the online system takes only a couple of minutes to complete and will ensure that your entry is processed correctly and the payment is processed immediately via our secure system .</p> <p>When entering online you MUST provide a school/institution email address. For your entry to be accepted into the event we will require confirmation from your school/institution that you do attend their institution and confirmation of your school year. This will be completed via email.</p> <p>We would recommend that you complete the application online to ensure all of your details are correct.</p> <p>By using the online booking system it will eliminate the chance of your entry getting lost in the post, processing errors of your details and allow a secure payment to be made.</p> <p>The online entry system can be accessed via www.britishjudo.org.uk/enteronline or www.britishschoolsjudo.org</p> <p>Unfortunately we cannot accept card payments from American Express cards.</p> <p>Closing date for entries is strictly Friday 24th February 2012 OR when 450 entries have been received.</p>
Participation:	<p>Event Eligibility</p> <p>This is a Level 3, Development event and is not open to the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any player who has been a member of any Home Countries Squad programme (including co-opted players) in the last three years. • Any player who has won a medal at the British Championships (Pre cadet, Cadet or Junior) in the last three years. However this event is open to players that have medalled at the British Championships for 10/11 year olds. <p>Talent ID Staff from the Home Countries' programmes will be at the championships and medallists may be invited to attend the England Squad Area Training Sessions. Coaches from Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland are asked to respect this qualification and not enter over qualified players.</p> <p>This event is open to all school children who comply with the criteria above. However, if the player is a member of an association other than the BJA, Judo Scotland, NIJF, WJA, AJA or BJC, players must send a copy of their association's insurance policy to the BJA, Suite B, Loughborough Technology Centre, Epinal Way, Loughborough LE11 3GE. No entry can be accepted from such players without proof of insurance.</p> <p>Players from Associations that do not have or cannot produce proof of insurance will be given the option of buying BJA temporary cover on the day, however the player/s entry into the event MUST have been received before the closing date for entries (Friday 24th February 2012).</p> <p>If you are unsure that your insurance will be accepted at this event please contact James Sills on 01509 631695.</p>

	<p>Categories and minimum grades:</p> <p>Academic years 6 and 7: born 1st Sept 1999 – 31st Aug 2001 <u>minimum grade</u> – orange belt</p> <p>Academic years 8 and 9: born 1st Sept 1997 – 31st Aug 1999 <u>minimum grade</u> – orange belt</p> <p>Academic years 10 and 11: born 1st Sept 1995 – 31st Aug 1997 <u>minimum grade</u> – green belt</p> <p>Academic years 12 and 13: born 1st Sept 1993 – 31st Aug 1995 <u>minimum grade</u> – blue belt</p> <p>All coaches will be responsible for ensuring that their athletes are ready for this level of competition.</p> <p>All players MUST bring their VALID judo membership and record book (licence) to the event.</p>								
<p>Competition Format:</p>	<p>Compound Knockout will be used in categories where there are more than 8 players. In categories where there are 8 players or less, pools and knockout will be used.</p> <p>The Tournament Director reserves the right to amalgamate categories where there are insufficient entries and also reserves the right to subdivide categories where appropriate.</p> <p>Contest Times</p> <table border="0"> <tr> <td>Academic years 6 and 7:</td> <td>Three minutes</td> </tr> <tr> <td>Academic years 8 and 9:</td> <td>Three minutes</td> </tr> <tr> <td>Academic years: 10 and 11:</td> <td>Four minutes</td> </tr> <tr> <td>Academic years 12 and 13:</td> <td>Four minutes</td> </tr> </table> <p>Two minutes <i>Golden Score</i> in all categories .</p> <p>Medals will be given out at the end of each category.</p> <p>There will also be an overall winning school trophy awarded to the school with the most points accumulated during the day. Schools can gain points by the following:</p> <p>1 point – for each competitor that competes in at least one contest at the event 2 points – for a competitor that wins a bronze medal 4 points – for a competitor that wins a silver medal 6 points – for a competitor that wins a gold medal</p> <p>Any one competitor can only earn a maximum of 7 points, for example winning a gold medal and having competed in at least one contest.</p> <p>This trophy will be awarded post event.</p> <p>Players called up first may wear a blue judogi if they wish. <p>Registration & Weigh In</p>	<p>Saturday 10th March 2012 in the Badminton Hall at the English Institute of Sport - Sheffield (located across the road from iceSheffield) at the following times:</p> <p>08:30 – 09:15 Academic Years 10 and 11 10:15 – 10:45 Academic Years 6 and 7 and Academic Years 8 and 9 11:15 – 11:45 Academic Years 12 and 13 10:00am Competition starts</p> <p>All competitors MUST bring their VALID judo licence to registration.</p> <p>As a high number of the competitors are going to be under 18 an open weigh in will take place at this event, therefore all players entering this event regardless of age will be weighed in under U18 rules.</p> <p>Please note that due to this, ALL competitors will receive the weight allowance and therefore ALL Male competitors MUST weigh in wearing their competition judogi trousers and ALL Female competitors MUST weigh in wearing their competition judogi trousers and t-shirt. For boys, 0.5kg allowance is given and for girls, 0.6kg allowance is given.</p> <p>Players are NOT permitted to change in the designated official weigh-in area.</p> <p>SWEATING OFF: If a player is seen by BJA staff or officials sweating off, they will be asked to go straight to the scales and weigh in. A toilet visit is of course allowed <u>in this situation</u> but no more running. If the athlete refuses to go to the scales they will be withdrawn from the competition.</p>



<p>British School Championships guidelines – for judoka and parents</p>	<p>Judoka</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Help beginners or lower grades , if you can. • Following all judo rules throughout the event. • Bow correctly at the beginning and end of a contest. It is not whether you win or lose, but how you play the game. • Accept decisions; let your coach ask any necessary questions. • Control your temper, do not shout or abuse other judoka or officials. • Be a good sport, cheer all good play, and respect all of your fellow judoka. • Remember that the aims of the British Schools Championships are to have fun and to help you develop as a judoka. Improve your skills and conduct yourself in a sportsman like manner, plus represent the ideals, disciplines and etiquette of the British Judo Association to the highest level. • Treat all other judoka as you would like to be treated, do not take unfair advantage of any judoka. • Co-operate with your coach and opponents, without them you do not have a game. <p>Parents</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Please be aware that children develop differently, at different rates and react differently to the same pressures. • Children and young people are involved in organised sport for their enjoyment as well as yours and so please respect this at all times. • Always encourage your child to train and compete by the rules of judo. • Teach your child that effort and teamwork are as important as victory, so that the result of each contest is accepted without unnecessary disappointment and with a positive sporting attitude. • Never ridicule or shout at your child for making a mistake or losing a contest. • Children learn best by example. Applaud good play by your team and by members of the opposing team. • Do not question publicly the officials' judgement and never their honesty. • Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from children's sporting activities. • Set an example by being friendly to the parents of the opposition, emphasis e enjoyment and fun, praise and reinforce effort and improvement.
